Abstract

Buprenorphine is a novel analgesic useful in the management of acute and chronic pain and is particularly useful in high-risk populations such as the elderly and those with substance use disorders. The use of buprenorphine for pain management will be reviewed and the management of acute and chronic pain in patients with addiction will be discussed, including management of the pregnant patient through delivery and the postpartum period.
